Description of the The subject vehicles are equipped with a main Center High Mounted Stop Lamp

Noncompliance: (CHMSL) designed to activate when the rear spoiler is in a retracted position,

and an auxiliary CHMSL designed to activate when the rear spoiler is deployed. The spoiler deploys automatically at predetermined speeds. However, the driver can also manually deploy the spoiler at lower speeds. On the affected vehicles, both CHMSLs are activated in tandem only when the rear spoiler is

manually deployed at speeds below 90 km/h.

FMVSS 1: 108 - Lamps, reflective devices, and assoc. Equipment

Description of the Safety Risk: Simultaneous activation of two CHMSLs may be confusing to operators of

vehicles behind the subject vehicle which may increase the risk of rear-end

crashes.

Description of the Cause: The issue is caused by a software error in the rear spoiler control unit.

Chronology:

Early June 2023 – Porsche was informed that on the subject vehicles manufactured before Calendar Week 20, both CHMSLs are activated in tandem when the rear spoiler is manually deployed at speeds below 90 km/h.

Porsche reviewed the effect of the subject issue on compliance with FMVSS No. 108 and concurrently identified the number of potentially affected vehicles.

June 21, 2023 – Porsche determined that the subject issue was a noncompliance with FMVSS No. 108.

Description of Remedy:

Description of Remedy Program: The rear spoiler control unit will be reprogrammed with a new data set.

The owner's letter will not include a statement about customer

reimbursement for pre-notification remedies as all of the affected vehicles

are still covered under Porsche New Car Limited Warranty.

How Remedy Component Differs The updated data set prevents both CHMSLs from illuminating in tandem
